EXPRESSION ECRITE -- 1999

Choose ONE of the following subjects: (300 words)

- a) Imagine what had happened to Anna.
- b) Years later, the narrator is surprised to get a letter from Anna. What is it about?

EXPRESSION ÉCRITE -- 2000

Choose one of the following subjects. (300 words)

- 1 Imagine the end of the story.
- 2 Do you enjoy reading detective stories or do you prefer another type of literature? Explain why.

EXPRESSION -- 2001

Choose one of the following subjects. (300 words)

1. A few days Britt' s belief that " later, Britt confesses her lie to her mother. Write their conversation.
2. Do you agree with You could have anything you wanted if only you tried hard enough" ? Justify your answer, giving examples.

EXPRESSION – 2002

Write both essays:

- 1) A father tries to convince his son that education is the only road to success. His son disagrees. Imagine the dialogue. (150 words)
- 2) Do you personally think money has become the priority in modern society ? (150 words)

EXPRESSION -- 2004

Choose subject 1 or subject 2.

Subject 1: a) "He clung to the things that reminded him of the old country." Comment on this attitude. (300 words)

Subject 2 : a) What do you think of today's growing need to communicate? (150 words)

b) 1.8 -1.9: "she looked up at the house with an expression of dismay. He smiled and touched her arm ..."

The mother is obviously disappointed with her new environment. Imagine the conversation she has with her husband. (150 words)

EXPRESSION – 2005

Choose one of the following subjects.

1. 1. 2. "...Hong Kong, Australia and South Africa. They were good times..."
Would you be ready to go and live in faraway countries if it meant getting a better life? (300 words)

2. a) Do "garden fetes, village cricket" and "theme pubs" correspond to your vision of Britain? (150 words)

b) How can you account for young people's attraction to designer clothes? Do you approve of it? (150 words)

EXPRESSION -- 2006

Choose subject 1(a+b) or subject 2.

b. Should French diplomas be valid everywhere in Europe? (150 words)

2. How can overcoming obstacles at school or at work make someone stronger? Illustrate your point with one or two examples. (300 words)
