1/ Simon Says

One player takes the role of "Simon" and gives instructions (usually physical actions such as "jump in the air" or "stick out your tongue") to the other players, which should be followed only when "Simon" starts the phrase with "Simon says". Players are eliminated from the game by either following instructions that are not immediately preceded by the phrase, or by failing to follow an instruction which does include the phrase "Simon says".

2/ Kim Game

The Aim of the game is to observe and memorize objects.

☆ <u>Kim kidnapped</u>: all the objects are placed on the table. The players observe and then close their eyes while the leader removes 1 object. What object is missing?

 Φ <u>Kim exchanged</u>: all the objects are placed on the table. The players observe and then close their eyes, the leader exchanges 2 objects. Which objects were exchanged?

 Φ <u>Kim moved</u>: all the objects are placed on the table., The players observe and then close their eyes and the leader moves 1 object. What object was moved? What was his place before the exchange?

P<u>Kim added</u>: 5 objects are already placed on the table. After observation the players close their eyes and the leader adds an object. What is this object?

3/ The Hangman Game

The aim of the game is to find a word by guessing the letters that compose it before being hanged.

The two players are for example Yacine and Sofia. Sofia thinks of a word. She draws the gallows and a row of dashes, as many letters as there are in the word. Yacine offers a letter. If the letter is in the word, Sofia writes it in its place, on a dash, as many times as the letter is in the word. Otherwise Sofia draws the first line of the hanged man (see the dotted lines). We continue the game until Yacine wins the game by finding all the letters. Sofia wins the game by completing the drawing of the hanged man.


Material:

A table of various objects: book, pencil, scissors, cup, spoon, fork, toys, coins...

Note:

For the smallest (4/5 years) start with 5 objects maximum. Then gradually add objects for the older ones. Thus from 7/8 years old, children will be able to memorize at least 10 objects
