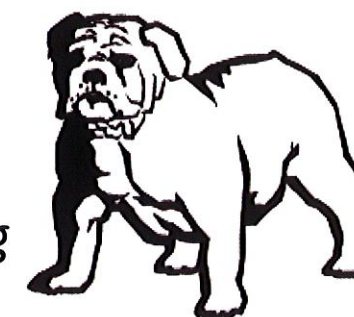
## Well-known British Dogs

### Bulldog



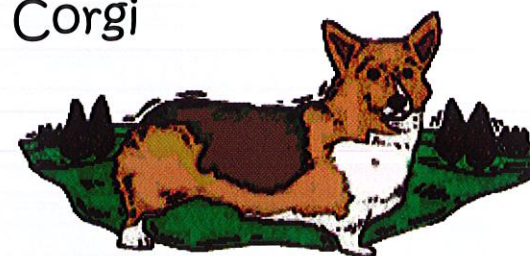

### Scottish Terrier



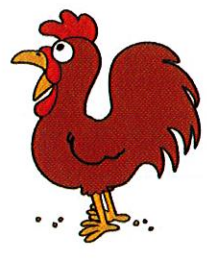
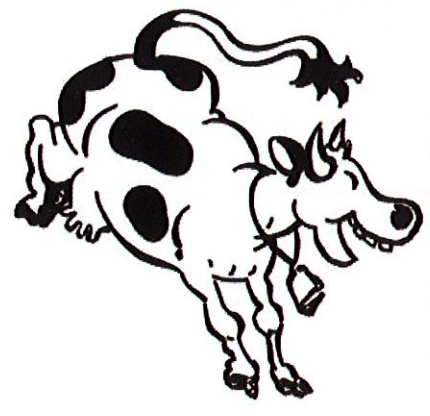
The 'Scotty' dog is well known for being obstinate yet very loyal and faithful. Their coats need to be trimmed regularly to keep them free from knots and tangles.

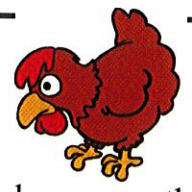

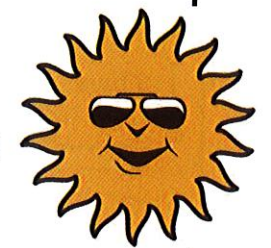

Chinese New Year

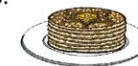
Starts in January or February. 2007 was the year of the pig and the New Year started on Sunday 18 February.

23<sup>rd</sup> St George's Day

The national day of England. A story dating back to the 6th century tells that St George rescued a maiden by slaying a fearsome fire-breathing dragon. Some people wear a red rose on St Georges Day.

People celebrate the end of a long winter. A traditional May Day dance is known as Maypole Dancing.

Summer Holidays British schools close for five weeks.

St. Andrew is the patron saint of Scotland. Scottish people celebrate St Andrew's Day.

24<sup>th</sup> Christmas Eve

A very exciting time for young children as it is the night when Santa comes with presents.

25<sup>th</sup> Christmas

Celebrates the birth of Jesus, whom Christians believe to be the son of God.

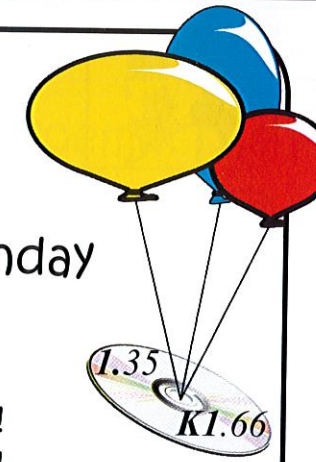
