Traditional Haggis Recipe

Haggis is typically served on Burns' Night, January 25, when Scotland celebrates the birth of its greatest poet, Robert Burns. During the celebration, Burns' poems are read, and the haggis is addressed by a member of the party quoting verses from Burns' poem, 'Address to a Haggis.' A typical meal for Burns Night would include a haggis with tatties-an'-neeps. Served with whisky!

- 1 sheep's stomach bag
- 2 lb. dry oatmeal
- 1 lb. suet
- 1 lb. lamb's liver
- 2 1/2 cups stock
- 1 large chopped onion
- 1/2 tsp. pepper and salt



Boil liver and the onion, add the oatmeal then mince them together. Fill the sheep's stomach bag with the mixture. Sew up securely. Prick the haggis in several places so that it does not burst. Place haggis in boiling water and boil slowly for 4-5 hours. Serves 12.

Home-Made Custard Recipe

This is a sweet sauce served with desserts.

- 600ml (1 pint) milk
- 6-8 egg yolks
- 50g (2 oz) sugar.
- Vanilla flavouring.

Boil the milk, remove from the stove and add the vanilla flavouring. Beat the egg yolks and sugar until thick and creamy, then add the hot milk. Place in a saucepan and cook, stirring constantly, until the custard thickens.

A Rowie

A salty bun served for breakfast in Aberdeenshire.

Bangers and Mash

Bangers and Mash is a traditional English dish consisting of sausages and mashed potato.

Hot cross Bun

This raisin and cinnamon bun has a 'cross' marked on the top and is traditionally served at Easter time in the UK.

Bubble and Squeak Recipe

Cooking this dish is easy, you'll need the following ingredients:

- 1lb of left-over boiled, mashed or roasted potatoes
- 1/2lb - 1lb of left-over cabbage or brussels sprouts
- butter or oil
- salt and black pepper

Mash the potatoes. Chop up the cabbage and mix both these together, adding salt and pepper. Place butter into a frying pan and heat. Add the cabbage and potatoes and form into a patty and let cook.

You might hear the distinctive squeak which gives bubble and squeak its name around this point. The 'bubble' part probably comes from the first stage of cooking the potatoes and cabbage, which are typically boiled.

Bubble and Squeak can often be served as part of a Full English Breakfast with eggs, baked beans, fried tomatoes, sausages, bacon, and perhaps black pudding!

Porridge Recipe

- A cup of oatmeal.
- Four cups of water.
- 1/2 tsp salt.
- 2 tsp sugar.
- 1/2 cup of milk.



A famous Scottish breakfast: -Take one cup of oatmeal, put into a saucepan with four cups of cold water. Stir gently over a low heat until it bubbles. Continue to stir for five minutes. Add half a teaspoon of salt and two teaspoons of sugar, and half a cup of milk. Give a final good stir and serve in a warm bowl.

Yorkshire Pudding

One of the great British inventions! It is a pastry made from batter and cooked in roast beef dripping. When cooked successfully, it puffs up high like a soufflé. Add sausages before you cook it and it is Toad in the Hole.

Ploughman's Lunch

This is a traditional lunch of cheese, bread and chutney served in pubs.

Guinness

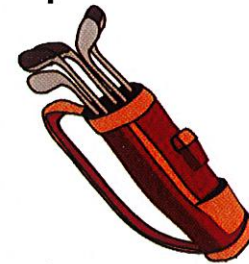
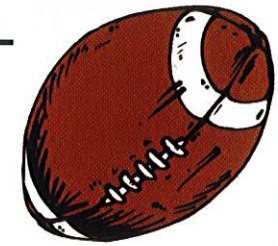
Events include 'tossing the caber,' 'throwing the hammer', 'tug o' war', 'hill racing' and Highland dancing.
