London is the capital of England and lies in the south east. It is very popular with tourists who come to see Buckingham Palace, the home of the Royal Family, Big Ben and many other sights.

Wales lies to the west of England. Welsh is spoken in Wales. Go to page 81 to see their National Anthem in English and in Welsh. Cardiff is the capital of Wales and lies in the south of Wales. The Welsh people have a reputation for their wonderful singing. Rugby is their national sport.

Ireland is an island to the west of Wales. It is called the Emerald Isle because it is so green and beautiful. Belfast is the capital of Northern Ireland and is in the north east of Ireland. Dublin is the capital of The Republic of Ireland, and is in the east of Ireland. Dublin is a very vibrant city with many bars serving Guinness (see page 42).
