England is the largest country in Great Britain. England is split into different regions called 'counties'. The British National anthem can be found on page 81.

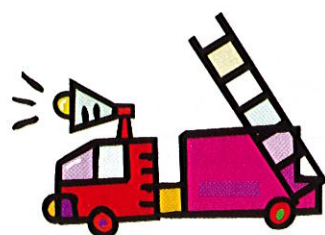
London is the capital of England and lies in the south east. It is very popular with tourists who come to see Buckingham Palace, the home of the Royal Family, Big Ben and many other sights.

Scotland lies to the *north* of England. It has many islands. One famous island in the *north west* of Scotland is called the **Isle of Skye**. (See page 82 for a song about it). In the Highlands of Scotland a language called Gaelic is spoken. The kilt is the national costume and whisky is distilled there. The Scots sing a famous song called 'Oh Flower of Scotland' at sporting events - see page 81. **Edinburgh** is the capital of Scotland and lies in the *south east* of Scotland. The Edinburgh Festival is a famous music and drama event held in August every year.

Wales lies to the *west* of England. Welsh is spoken in Wales. Go to page 81 to see their National Anthem in English and in Welsh. **Cardiff** is the capital of Wales and lies in the *south* of Wales. The Welsh people have a reputation for their wonderful singing. Rugby is their national sport.

Ireland is an island to the *west* of Wales. It is called the **Emerald Isle** because it is so green and beautiful. **Belfast** is the capital of **Northern Ireland** and is in the *north east* of Ireland. **Dublin** is the capital of **The Republic of Ireland**, and is in the *east* of Ireland. Dublin is a very vibrant city with many bars serving Guinness (see page 42).
