To what extent do you think that exchanges between the US and developing countries may be beneficial (or detrimental)? Give your opinion. (120 words)

The importance of exchange for economic development can <u>hardly</u> be <u>overestimated</u>. Almost everyone participates in a large number and variety of transactions every day. So in different fields, exchange plays a crucial part in a country's development.

However, it 's important to understand that there should be some <u>bargaining</u> between two governments and justice in the relations between the two <u>partners</u>.

Every partner should find some <u>rewards</u> or benefits in the exchange. For example, <u>Trade</u> flows between the two countries include all kinds of <u>goods</u> and services, which reflects the breadth of exchanges between the two economies. According to Eurostat data, the United States has a surplus for certain goods such as energy (\$2.8 billion), whereas France has a surplus in wine and liquors (\$3.7 billion), and pharmaceutical products (\$3.3 billion).

<u>However</u>, in many cases, there are not <u>mutual</u> benefits. Sometimes, emerging or poor countries are <u>vulnerable</u> or too weak to oppose the <u>terms</u> of a superpower like the USA or China. For example, oil is a product which is essential. In our consummer society, <u>you can't do without it</u>. Many countries have to import <u>oil</u> so they become dependent on the prices imposed by the producing countries. America exports oil and then its economy is not so <u>fragile</u>. This also helps understand why America as a nation does not make a lot of efforts to fight <u>the reduction of global carbon emission</u> and for climate change.

With <u>globalization</u>, exchanges have developed <u>to such a pace</u> that all the parts of the world are connected. <u>The world has become a village</u>. So, we understand better how we are dependent on each other.
